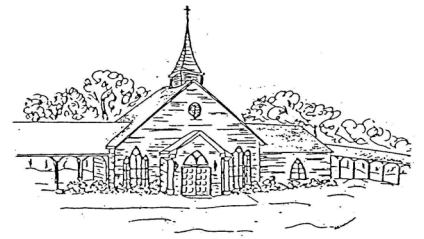

The Journey Towards Love: An Epiphany Reflection

Imagine that in the times of biblical shepherders, Magi, and stables where babies are born, the nights were bitter, cold, and isolating. Travelers attempting to navigate the perils of journeys in the wilderness must have been filled with curiosity, and maybe some trepidation. The text tells us the Magi noticed a star that shined differently in the sky – something had changed, the wind had shifted, and they wanted to know more. The Magi set out to follow a star: a star that shined so bright it filled the sky with unparalleled light; a light beckoned the magi onto a journey that led them along a path. Not just any star, not just any journey, and not just any path, this path led the Magi to witness Love incarnate.

It wouldn't be too much of a stretch to see parallels to our contexts. At the conclusion of the Christmas season, this time of celebrating the birth of our savior we may find ourselves seeking light and love. Maybe the holidays were filled with opportunities to relish in the glory of the birth of Christ and we are now searching for ways to share that joy. Others may have felt the enormity of shorter days and yearning for the light to pierce the heaviness. For the Magi, as well as for us, God has promised that Love incarnate is within in our reach. All that is asked of us is to follow the proverbial star.

The season of Epiphany allows us to be intentional about recognizing the ways in which God's love is tangible even in the most unconventional places. |

We elect members of our vestry who are representatives of the parish with specific responsibilities by the canons of The Episcopal Church. They share leadership responsibilities with the rector. Also, during the annual meeting, the parish receives reports from ministries, the treasurer, and a "State of the Church" report from the rector.

I grew up in Topeka, Kansas where I was fortunate to attend Grace Cathedral, a late 19th century traditional gothic church with a strong Sunday school program and Choir. That church community was large and at the same time very close-knit. The Season of Epiphany

Epiphany is a Greek word meaning “manifestation, showing forth, revelation. The season of Epiphany is a season of four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The number of weeks in the season varies according to the date of Easter. This year there are six Sunday’s in the Epiphany season. Epiphany proclaims that in Jesus, God is revealed to all people—not just a select few, but to all people, in all places, and throughout all time.

On Epiphany and the weeks that follow, the gospels will present a series of occasions at which Jesus was revealed to be God’s son. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus’ identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ.

One of the primary themes of Epiphany is the celebration of Christ as the light that has come into the world. “Arise, shine; for your light has come,

and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you...
Nations shall come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your dawn...
They shall bring gold and frankincense,
and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord. (Isaiah 60:1,3,6)



“May Almighty God, who led the Wise Men by the shining of a star to find the Christ, the Light from Light, lead you also, in your pilgrimage, to find the Lord” (*The Book of Occasional Services*).

May this be our prayer and desire, as we travel the Season of Epiphany.

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – November 24, 2024

Meeting was opened at 12:45 pm with prayer after lunch was enjoyed by group.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for October 2024 were reviewed; Twalla moved to approve minutes with two corrections, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial report for October 2024 was reviewed. Income for October was \$10,782.00. Expenses were \$12,657.15. Net Income for October was \$-1875.15. Income and expenses are typical for this time of year. Current balance in Restricted Funds is \$30,106.30. Balance in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of September 30 was \$258,948.71. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of October 31 was \$182,557.98. Twalla moved to approve October financial report, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) Budget considerations for 2025 were discussed.

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise for Len) Some ceiling leaks have been found in parish hall. DBM Roofing Company is sending a written estimate for replacement of parish hall roof; tentative estimate is around \$13,000. Church Insurance is sending a check for \$5793.71 for hurricane damage. Mario and Patty have repaired sprinkler heads and pressure washed the windows; now caulking is needed. Street signs need repair. Narthex carpet needs cleaning. Lower church walls need pressure washing. Paint is peeling on walkways; touchup is needed. Mario and Patty will work on these tasks. Stained glass window is leaking again; Jack Dell and Harry Moses are working on solution.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Angel tree will be in narthex on December 1; gifts are due December 22. Advent Book Study, The Love That is God, will be held in parish hall on December 4, 11, and 18. ECW Coffee Hour and Cookie Walk will be after 10:30 service on December 15. Vestry will meet on December 15 at 11:45 am. Greening of the church will be on Monday and Tuesday, December 23 and 24. Christmas Eve service will be at 5 pm and Christmas Day service will be at 10:30 am.

Business:

1. Cleanup and repair following damage from Hurricane Helene continues.
2. Nominations for new vestry members will be presented in December.

Ministry Reports: Already covered.

Meeting was adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 2:35 pm.
