Dear People of Annunciation,

In the Lenten devotion booklet, 'Savior Servant Friend' of which you will find a copy to take home on the table in the Narthex, the Rev. Sutton says, "Lent provides us with a perfect chance to explore the extraordinary attributes of our Savior, Servant, Friend, who is Jesus, and marvel at the blessings we receive from his suffering, death, and resurrection." I couldn't have summed up the season of Lent any better. Lent is a time we get a short course in the meaning of baptism; by teaching us who we are, where we have come from, and where we are going.

Our Lenten journey to the cross always begins on Ash Wednesday. This year Ash Wednesday is on March 5, a day when we have ashes smudged on our foreheads to remind us of our mortality and need for forgiveness. The 40 days of Lent will end on the Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday, which this year is on April 13. The traditions that Christians draw upon all over the world in celebrating Lent and Easter, are not only among the oldest forms of Christian worship, they are also surely the richest.

The suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus that has inspired our liturgy, worship, and ritual throughout the history of the church continues to inspire people today to reflect and pray on the mystery of Christ's suffering and the wonder of his resurrection. There are many opportunities to reflect and grow in our spirituality to make this Lenten season more meaningful, as we prepare for Easter. We may even find that the ways we "keep a holy Lent" will help lay a foundation on which we can continue to grow in our faith throughout the rest of the year.

**Lent Madness** is a fun, engaging way to learn about the men and women comprising the Church's Calendar of Saints. 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting n the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch. 

## Lenten Book Study 2025 - Rowan William's Passions of the Soul



The 1Book1Diocese read for Lent 2025 will be Rowan Williams' deeply wise book Passions of the Soul. In this brief text the former Archbishop of Canterbury tells how selfawareness about our instincts and emotions can offer practical assistance in diagnosing what is binding us to unhelpful and potentially destructive patterns of thinking. In the process, Williams shows how these thoughts like pride or anger are not necessarily wrong in themselves if we attend to these thoughts properly. He states, "For the Eastern Christian writers, 'passion' is the whole realm of instinct, reaction, coping mechanisms, and this is the level at which complications arise. We cannot live without these things if we are to be human at all; yet unless we understand and in some degree transfigure them, we are trapped in something less than human."

Williams' takes an original turn in pairing each of these eight thoughts, that became the seven deadly sins in Western Christianity, with the beatitudes. This accessible introduction to insight from ancient Christian writers offers a pragmatic approach to examining where we can let unhealthy tapes play within our minds. Sewanee's Professor of Pastoral Theology, Mother Julia Gatta writes, "It is a gem...*Passions of the Soul merits multiple readings to savor the superb wordcraft and absorb the wisdom of its pages.*"

## The Disciple's Way: Daily Devotions for Lent

<u>Forward Movement</u>'s Lenten daily devotions book is now available. Forward Movement began with a bold summons to follow Jesus. The first publication, *The Disciple's Way, issued a stirring call to individuals and the wider church to practice seven steps of discipleship: turn, follow, learn, pray, serve, worship, and share.* That call is as urgent today as it was 90 years ago.

In this season of Lent, embrace the seven steps with encouragement from the original publication and daily meditations written by current leaders of the church. As the first Disciple's Way promised, this journey is high adventure, requiring time, effort, pluck, and money. Following Jesus is not easy, but it is The Way.

Meeting was opened at 12:15 pm with prayer after lunch was enjoyed by group.

Vestry Members Meditation study was completed.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for December 2024 were reviewed; Twalla moved to approve minutes with three corrections, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol, motion passed.

<u>Financial Report:</u> (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial report for December 2024 was reviewed. Income for December was \$19,862.00. Expenses were \$12,731.24. Net Income for December was \$7130.76. Income and expenses are typical for end of year. Balance in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of December 31 was \$260,381.26. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of December 31 was \$165,825,29. Twalla moved to approve December financial report with a footnote addendum referencing Investment Income as follows: \*An additional amount of \$15,000 was withdrawn from Max and Christie Manry State Street Investment Account in November 2024 (approved at the October 2024 Vestry meeting) to pay for tree removal and cleanup resulting from Hurricane Helene damage; the \$15,000 was placed directly into the Restricted Building Repair and Maintenance Fund in November 2024", 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol, motion passed.

#### Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) No Report.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: (Rev. Denise and Len) Repair of Parish Hall roof is scheduled to begin soon. Fence repair will be scheduled to be done. Mario and Patty need a scaffold to reach top of window to complete repair on front of church building. Len now has a bucket truck that can be used and he will do the work as soon as possible. If he needs help, Mario and Patty will be available. Mario and Patty will clean nursery carpet after Parish Hall roof is replaced. Some new ceiling tiles will be needed after Parish Hall roof is replaced.

<u>Rector's Report:</u> (Rev. Denise) Annual meeting will be held next week on January 26, after 10:30 am service. There will be a short vestry meeting following the annual meeting. Two new vestry members will be elected at annual meeting. Rev. Denise thanked Twalla and Beverly for their service as they are rolling off vestry. Rev. Denise thanked for the very good job she did cleaning out and organizing the kitchen cabinets. Spring cleaning will be scheduled before Holy Week. Rev. Denise will be out of town from February 11 to February 24. Rev. Todd Hoover will serve as supply priest on February 16 at both 8 am and 10:30 am service. Morning Prayer Service will be held at 10:30 am on February 23. Shrove Tuesday pancake supper will be held on March 4. Ash Wednesday services will be held on March 5 at 12 noon and 6 pm. Corned Beef Dinner may be held on March 17 to earn funds for Restricted Building and Maintenance Fund. Next Vestry meeting will be on 2/9/2025.

Business:

- 1. Proposed budget for 2025 was reviewed and discussed. Twalla moved to approve the budget, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Len, motion passed.
- 2. Regarding Business Item #3 on December 2024 Minutes: No funds were taken from BOA Church Corp Investment Account to cover cost of new roof on Parish Hall building; withdrawal of \$15,000 in funds was not needed due to additional payment from Church Insurance in the amount of \$11,852.40 that has been received.

Ministry Reports: Already covered.

Meeting was adjourned at 2 pm with Lord's Prayer.


